**THE IMPORTANCE OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**  
Christian Education is a lifelong process, and we all share in the responsibility for the Christian Education of our young children. It takes a minimum of 7 caring adults to help in the faith formation process of children. Research by Vibrant Faith Ministries clearly shows

- Continue your own lifelong learning and faith development. Show by your own example that lifelong learning is important in faith formation.
- Actively involve youth in service projects. More importantly, participate with youth in service projects.
- Encourage all of our youth to attend Bible camp. Studies have shown that a week at camp has had a significant impact on their faith development.

Jesus said, "Let the children come to me." As we approach the beginning of another term of Christian Education, let us recommit ourselves, joining together in the task of the faith formation for our children and ourselves. Faith is caught more than it is taught so I especially challenge the adults to help in the faith formation process.

that when parents are actively involved in the faith formation of their children the probability that faith will be an important part of their adult lives will greatly increase.

What specifically can we do together to help in the faith formation of our children? Listed below are some of the things we can do together and will be emphasized through the educational ministry at Trinity Lutheran:

- Keep our children in prayer daily. Pray that they will continue to grow in faith.
- Worship regularly and take special note of children in worship and help them know how important is for them to be there.
- Generously support the Christian Education program by providing Bibles, study materials and other study helps for our children.
- Volunteer to teach in the Christian Education program: Sunday School and the Confirmation program.

### BRING A FRIEND TO CHURCH

Every survey that I have read shows that the best way to bring people to Christ and the church is by direct invitation from a relative or friend. You, the members of Trinity Lutheran are the best evangelists we have and I encourage you to reach out with the love of Christ to those around you. One survey shows that 75–95% of the people who came to Christ and the church came by direct contact by a relative, neighbor or friend. Only 5–6% came by direct contact by a pastor.

## Deacons Announce Fall Worship Changes

Pastor Bob Hansen and the Board of Deacons are pleased to announce upcoming worship changes in Trinity.

- The Saturday evening service will return beginning on September 4th at 6:00 p.m. A potluck meal will be served before the service at 5:00 p.m. It will be a communion service. It will be a special service as Betty Jensen will be celebrating her 99th birthday. Her son, Mark, will be providing the message that evening and also at the Sunday 9:30 a.m. service on September 5th.
- The Saturday evening 6:00 p.m. service will be held on the first Saturday of every month beginning in October. A potluck meal will be served before the service at 5:00 p.m.
- We will be returning to two Sunday services beginning on Rally Day – September 12th, with either the 8:45 a.m. service or the 11:00 a.m. service.
- Beginning Sunday, September 19th, communion in the sanctuary will be changed. There will be two stations for Holy Communion. Ushers will direct

one pew at a time up for communion, to provide for social distancing. The pastor and communion assistants will be wearing masks and gloves. For safety reasons, communion wafers will be now used. The communion cups in each tray will be separated out (like spokes on a wheel) and the tray will be offered to each individual who can then pick up their own cup.

- Should anyone wish to remain in their pew seat and not go forward for communion, the ushers will have a basket containing the wafer/grape juice cups for anyone to use.

**Please remember – COVID is still a real possibility for Lake County and our community. What we are planning for now is subject to change. Should our COVID numbers spike upwards for our community and/or Lake County, we will let everyone know what could change.**

The 100th Anniversary of our Sanctuary will be held on Sunday, November 14th. Bishop Constanze Hagmaier will be the guest preacher at both services. More to follow!

President Rob Thuringer called the special meeting to order at 8:05 p.m. Earlier in the day, he and Vice-President Brown had emailed the two covenant agreements for Rev. Robert D. Hansen as Interim Pastor and Deacon Suzanne G. Hansen that were written and sent to Trinity by the SD Synod Office in Sioux Falls.

Rev. Robert D. Hansen's *Covenant for Interim Pastoral Ministry* would cover the period of August 1, 2021 to August 1, 2022. President Thuringer shared that he and Vice-President Brown had met with both Pastor Bob and Deacon Suzanne before this Zoom meeting.

Deacon Suzanne G. Hansen's *Covenant for Interim*

*Ministry* would cover the period of July 1, 2021 to August 1, 2022.

Discussion points were:

- The question was would Deacon Suzanne stay on as our Interim Faith Formation Director after we had called a new Lead Pastor? *It was thought that we would have to meet with her and discuss that option. As it stands now, if Pastor Bob's covenant ended with the call of a new Lead Pastor, her call as our Deacon would end as well.*
- Mileage would be paid to the Hansens for travel to Madison and back home to Brandon, SD. *The use of the church vehicle had not been discussed yet, however, they could choose to use it locally or when they needed another vehicle. They will be carpooling together when they come to Trinity.*
- Pastor Bob would work .75 time each week, spending two days a week at Trinity, one day working at home, and here on Sunday. He would get one Sunday off each month.
- Deacon Suzanne would begin at Trinity on Monday, July 12th.
- Compensation was discussed as the question was "could we afford to do this?" *Vice-President Brown said that the two covenants together are*

The agenda was presented by President Thuringer and with no additions Danny Brown made a motion to approve the agenda and Brianna Routier seconded. Motion passed.

The council minutes from June 8th were presented and Danny Brown made a motion to approve the minutes and Susan Farrell-Poncelet seconded. Motion passed.

The special church council meeting which was by Zoom videoconference on July 1st at 8:00 P.M. were presented and this meeting was to approve Rev. Robert D. Hansen for Covenant for Interim Pastoral Ministry and Deacon Suzanne G. Hansen Covenant for Interim Ministry. A motion was made by Jennifer Briggs to approve the minutes and Nancy Sabbe seconded. The financial report was presented and it was reported we are \$42,000.00 behind. Jennifer Briggs made a motion to approve and seconded by Danny Brown. Motion approved.

President Rob Thuringer reported:

- The Call Committee had met with a candidate but at the second meeting he said that he and his wife had prayed about the call and felt it was not the appropriate time to leave his church.
- Council discussed the electronic sign board that Terry Schultz donated to the church and there were several questions. Jim Iverson volunteered to go to the city and check on rules and regulations of our placing the sign.
- We have had a volunteer say she would lector for services but would prefer to read from the balcony. The council said we should embrace this volunteer.
- In August have Lisa start contacting ushers and greeters, and lectors if needed etc.
- Pastor Bob and Suzanne will be in the office 2

days a week and 1 day at home working and doing the Sunday service this will be ¾ time. They will carpool together as we pay mileage.

- There was discussion as to get our membership list in order by trying to find out active members and members who have moved or left the church. Jim Iverson, Rob Thuringer, Kristin Morse, Lora Ersland will be working on this membership list.
- Lora Ersland is working on our computer program Realm and trying to see if they can do some clean up and what works well for Trinity.
- We discussed having the 100th Anniversary of our church sanctuary in October, also having a newspaper article in the *Madison Daily Leader*.

Vice President Danny Brown reported:

- Ryan Townsend has resigned from the Parish Ed board and Danny Brown will ask Lori Schultz to fill this position.
- Discussed finances and Danny is hoping our members will begin coming to our church as it is Open, now that many of the Covid-19 items have been removed.

Coffee hour has been started but we need volunteers to bring food items and make coffee and serve.

We have met with 8 service group leaders and we will be condensing our groups from 13 to 11 groups. The service groups will begin in September.

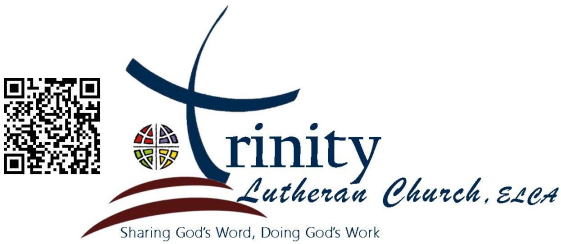
