President Danny Brown called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Wade Briggs led the devotions.

Motion by Jennifer Briggs, seconded by Lori Schultz, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Tim Walburg, seconded by Ron Jorgensen, to approve the minutes of the March 8, 2022, meeting as printed. Motion carried.

The Financial Report included:

- \$25,000 from a CD that matured in March has been applied to the I Am In campaign loan. There will be a line item in the budget under long-term liability for \$25,000 until this loan to ourselves is repaid. The congregation is paying 4% interest on this loan.
- The income to expenses includes a transfer from savings to cover expenses.

Motion by Brianna Routier, seconded by Jennifer Briggs, to approve the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Hansen:

- A new router has been installed in the office improving access to Wi-Fi.
- Lenten services have been well attended
- Pastor Bob and Deacon Suzanne are entitled to on Sunday off each month. They have used some of the time off and plan to use more in May.
- Trinity needs to name delegates to the Synod Assembly on June 3 and 4.

President Danny Brown:

- Reminded the Council that there are vacancies that the Council needs to fill. Carli Nighbert volunteered to be the Bethel Home delegate. A

name has been presented to the Executive Board for the Board of Parish Education, and the president hopes to have a name for the position of Financial Secretary at the next Council meeting.

- Jim Iverson will contact Diane Bruns for information about the Care Team.
- Reported that the church's back door was left standing open Monday evening. The police were called, and it was determined that nothing was missing or damaged. He will speak to the Scout Master about this event.

Vice-president Wade Briggs:

- No report

Deacon Suzanne:

- Expressed appreciation for the dedication and service of the members of the Board of Parish Education, Sunday School teachers, and confirmation guides.

Board of Deacons—Jim Iverson

- The Board will continue to discuss assuming the responsibility for the annual 80+ birthday party.
- The summer worship schedule will begin on Sunday, May 29, and continue through September 4. There will be one service each Sunday at 9:30 a.m. The Celebration Team is responsible for the first and second Sundays of the month. Services on the third and fourth Sundays will be traditional worship as will any fifth Sundays.
- Six individuals are scheduled to make bread for communion through June 2023.
- Pastor Bob and Deacon Suzanne will be gone May 15 and 22. Jim Iverson will be responsible for worship with communion on May 15, and Ann Marie Rossing will be responsible for the service on May 22.
- There are large print copies of the Celebration hymn book available. A note reminding the congregation will be included in the bulletin.
- The offerings from the soup suppers totaled \$1465.00 which will be applied to the I Am In campaign loan.

Board of Trustees—Corey Strom

- Joel Brick has all the supplies necessary to get the digital sign board functioning. He will be working on it after Easter.
- Will check on the price for a copier to replace the old one outside the Fireside Room.

- Examined the front door and will get it fixed.
 - New lights have been installed. The bill totaled \$7612.22 with a rebate of \$2150. The Board approved payment of the bill.
- Board of Parish Education—Kristin Morse
- \$200 camperships are available to Trinity youth attending a Lutheran Outdoors camp.
 - The Board voted to make a contribution to the Madison High School Baccalaureate ceremony.
 - Senior Sunday will be April 24. 16 seniors will participate.
 - The last day of Sunday School is May 1. Ice cream sundaes will be served between services making this a Sundae Sunday event.
 - Working on summer ministries.
 - Jennifer Briggs is meeting with the youth regarding a summer mission trip.
 - There will be approximately 27 children receiving their first communion on Thursday, April 14. The classes leading up to the first communion have been well attended, and the students receptive.

BUSINESS

President Danny reported that the Executive Board discussed how to present the financial information in the weekly bulletin. It should be as clear and transparent as possible. He will prepare a sample and forward it to the Council for input.

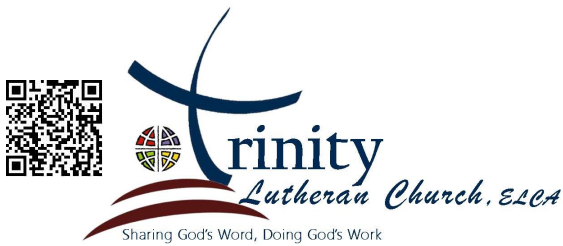
Experience
