It was last fall when I was going through my daily emails and opened up one with the subject line "IF: 2024...more tickets available!" I ran over to the preschool where Alicia Koch was substitute teaching and said something like, "I might be able to get us tickets to IF: 2024. It's in February in Texas. They just opened up more seating. I think God wants us to go."

Alicia and I had been praying and listening and following the Spirit together for the past nine months or so, and we were still in the early stages of both working together in women's ministry and in our friendship. However, three things we knew we had in common were our love of God, our call to women's ministry, and our desire to one day attend an IF Conference to learn from some of the greatest women's ministry speakers. So, that random fall day, we took a leap of faith, not knowing how we were going to make this trip happen, and we purchased those tickets to the IF:2024 Conference in Fort Worth, Texas. And we did it because of Jesus, because we knew we were being called there to prepare for God's work that would take place here at Trinity.

We asked and God graciously and abundantly provided. Alicia and I were blessed to receive a grant from the Trinity Foundation to cover our airfare, transportation, hotel, and tickets to IF:2024 in February. We were covered in prayer by the women in our Monday night Bible Study. Our families blessed us and sent us on our way!

There are not enough words to describe what Alicia and I experienced on this trip. We experienced God in so many ways and places... during conversations with our Uber drivers and people at our hotel (did I mention there was a cattle show and marathon at the same site as our conference?), while we waited in line to get into the conference each day and while we waited to order food (we did a lot of waiting and talking with others), and, of course, through the speakers who shared God's love with us and over 13,000 other women throughout the conference. We spent over an hour talking with a security guard about his faith journey and how he overcame severe health issues which brought him to Christ. During our "down time" we explored the city and shared with each other what we heard God calling us to at Trinity and as women called to share God's love with others.

Because of Jesus... we had an amazing experience, felt God confirm the work to be done, and we are anxious to share it with others. On Saturday, April 6, Alicia and I will be bringing IF:2024 to Trinity! Unfortunately the live speakers will not be there, but we have purchased access to the on demand videos of the conference. There will be lunch and what we hope to be lively conversation and dreaming. We cannot wait to share this all with the women of Trinity.

I know you have heard me say this already, but the Spirit is up to something, maybe even many somethings, here at Trinity. This story is just one example of taking a leap of faith, gathering in the name of Jesus, and going where the Spirit leads. Where else is the Spirit leading Trinity and who is feeling the nudge or hearing the call? Are you a Trinity female feeling called to attend our local IF:2024, or are you a Trinity male feeling called to attend One Year to Live? Are you wanting to start up a new Bible Study or work with our youth or college community? Because of Jesus... we gather together, we pray, we listen, we share God's love, and we do God's work. President Tom Farrell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Trinity's mission statement was recited.

Pastor Steve Lindley gave the devotion from *A Way Other Than Our Own* by Walter Brueggemann entitled "God of the Gnats."

Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Darrell Presuhn, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to approve the minutes of the January 9, 2024, meeting. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Tom Farrell presented the Financial Report as of the end of February:

Offering	\$54,637.73
Expenses	\$70,875.57
Expenses over Offering	(\$16,237.84)

The I Am In campaign continues to receive contributions. The account currently has a balance of \$1,928. Options for investing this balance were discussed. The consensus is to invest the balance in the I Am In account in a 7-month CD at First Bank and Trust.

It was noted that \$85,000 of the \$100,000 loan that was taken from the parsonage fund to pay off the I Am In loan has been repaid.

President Tom Farrell reported that the Trinity Foundation has transferred a total of \$202,568 from the Edwin Hanneman Endowment to Trinity Lutheran Church. It has been invested as follows;

\$ 50,000 in a Money Market account

\$ 52,568 in a 12-month Liquid CD at 4.5% \$100,00 in a 7-month CD at 4.95%

Pastor Steve Lindley explained that the budget line 6820.10 Custodian Salary will include subdivisions to accommodate both the Maintenance and the Custodian positions.

Motion by Jean Mitchell, seconded by Deacon Koren Lindley, to accept the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Steven Lindley submitted a written report. He noted that this is a busy time and that Holy Week begins in two weeks.

Deacon Koren Lindley submitted a written report. She highlighted the Communion for All Ages program that will be held on March 17 and the Holy Week in an Hour program. She reported that the fundraiser for Kendra Paulson raised over \$10,000.

President Tom Farrell welcomed the new members of the Church Council and expressed confidence that this will be a productive year.

Board of Trustees—Walker Ruhd reporting

- discussed the Stewards of God's Love campaign.
- developing a QR code to provide access to Realm, YouTube, etc., for the congregation.
- Walker Ruhd will refinish the baptismal font matching the color of it to the color of the railings.
- Sharol Bargmann has donated approximately \$6,000 toward the Narthex roof repair.
- Fertilizing and maintaining the irrigation system will be handled by Walker Ruhd. The contract with Madison Lawn Care for this service will be cancelled.
- Pastor Steve Lindley reported that he is looking into the donation of a new bowl for the baptismal font.

Board of Deacons-Virginia Lemme reporting

- Virginia Lemme and Pastor Steve Lindley have written a service for Good Friday titled "From the Manger to the Cross."
- there will be three services on Easter—7:00 a.m. Sunrise service, 8:45 a.m. traditional worship and 11:00 a.m. Celebration worship.
- jingle change collections totaled \$242.44. The total will be printed in the newsletter.
- soup suppers are well received.
- Karen Giles reported that 7 members received home communion in February.
- Lucas Muller is responsible for publicity. Send items in all formats to him.
- Board of Deacons wants to restart the Care Teams.
- Lucas Muller will assist in building relationships at DSU as a starting point for outreach to the campus.

President Tom Farrell introduced a team building exercise asking members when they gave their lives to Christ.

BUSINESS

- A transition plan for when Lisa and Bob Gale leave was discussed. Pastor Steve Lindley noted that some of the Receptionist's duties fall under the responsibilities of the Deacons. Online signup for various volunteer opportunities may be an option. The e-news might be biweekly instead of weekly. Lucas Muller suggested building up the social media channels. The Gales' departure will be announced in the e-news, the newsletter, and the bulletin.
- 2. The position of vice-president remains vacant. President Tom Farrell asked for a member of the Council to volunteer to serve as an interim vice-

president. Virginia Lemme volunteered. Motion by Tom Farrell to appoint Virginia Lemme to be the interim vice-president. Seconded by Dani Ruhd. Motion carried.

- 3. Pastor Steve Lindley suggested that Council consider tithing the gift of the Hanneman Endowment. Some possible uses for the tithe might be ELCA World Hunger, the local Welcome Corps, Shepherd's Table in Sioux Falls, return that amount to the Foundation to support missions, or use the funds for benevolence. No action was taken.
- 4. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Deacon Koren, to table discussion of the service groups. Motion carried.
- 5. There have been no additional applications for the custodian's position. The cleaning service is currently cleaning only twice a week. It may be beneficial to increase the hours of the cleaning service. Pastor Steve will work with the service to expand the hours through May. To expand the reach of the help wanted advertising Marie Millage will reach out to Handshake on the campus; Lucas Muller will create an Indeed account and advertise the position; Pastor Steve Lindley will create a paid Facebook post to promote the custodial opening.
- 6. President Tom Farrell asked for feedback on the change of the meeting format. There were no negative comments. The revised format will continue in April.

Motion to adjourn by Jean Mitchell. Seconded by Virginia Lemme.


