## From the Pastor's Pen

"By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things." - Galatians 5:22–23 -

Dear Trinity Family,

Grace and peace to you in this season of transformation and growth. In his letter to the Galatians, Paul reminds them of the free gift of **grace** - that all people are "justified not by the works of the law but through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ." He reminds them that the gospel has **set them free** from the power of sin and death, and the ways they are bound by them. And, in response to the assurance of the gospel, Paul encourages the church to set aside all of the thoughts, practices, and habits that fulfill their own selfish provisions, and to live life in the Holy Spirit.

One of the core principles to which we hold, as followers of Jesus, is that we are a faith community gathered by the Holy Spirit. We are formed, as individuals and as a community, by the work of the Spirit within and among us. We are inspired and empowered by the Spirit to dedicate our lives to living for others. We are summoned to listen and watch for the movement of the Spirit - to discern the ways God is at work in and around us, and to respond with zeal.

We do this by being a people whose life together is grounded in prayer; not only at our regular prescribed times of prayer, but throughout our days, whomever we are with, whatever happens to be going on, covering those interactions and relationships in prayer. We live our lives in the Spirit by immersing ourselves in God's word; reading Scripture every day, studying it, praying with it, discussing the word with others, so that the promises it contains are the lens through which we view the whole world. Living by the Spirit means regularly worshipping together, learning together, playing together, and through all of this, deepening our relationships with God and each other. This rhythm of prayer, learning, worship, and fellowship enables us to be more aware of and responsive to the Holy Spirit's presence and work in our lives.

Paul goes on to tell the Galatians that when they (and we) live their lives by the Spirit, it will cultivate and bear virtuous fruit in their life together. They will be marked by "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,

generosity, faithfulness. gentleness. and self-control." Imagine being a faith community who responds to disagreement with patience and kindness. rather than resentment. Envision responding to the needs of our neighbors with aenerosity and love. rather than



indifference. What if we became people who were known by our gentleness and our joy? What an awesome vision of this community of faith to which we all belong! I am grateful to be on this Spirit-led journey with you all, and am eager to see the fruit the Holy Spirit yields in us.

# **Unapproved June Council Meeting Minutes**

Trinity Lutheran Church Church Council meeting Tuesday, June 11, 2024 7:00 p.m.

President Tom Farrell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and led the Council in reciting Trinity's mission statement.

Present: Pastor Steve Lindley, Deacon Koren Lindley, President Tom Farrell, Vice-president Kurt Christiansen, Nancy Sabbe, secretary, Darrel Presuhn, Eric Anderson, Stacy Thomsen, Virginia Lemme, Karen Giles, Jean Mitchell, Walker Ruhd, Patti Weber, Melody Hansen, Dani Ruhd, Shelly Balogh

Absent and excused: Lucas Muller, Alicia Koch, Marie Millage

President Tom Farrell led a devotion reminding the Council to abide in gratitude and cultivate the fruits of the spirit during the summer and every season.

Pastor Steve Lindley prayed an opening prayer.

Motion by Darrel Presuhn, seconded by Virginia Lemme, to approve the agenda as printed. Motion carried.

Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Patti Weber, to approve the minutes of the May 14, 2024, meeting. Motion by Deacon Koren Lindley to amend the minutes of May 14 as follows: Change the first item of the Board of Deacons report to read "The first, second, and fifth Sundays will be traditional services. The third and fourth Sundays will be Celebration Services." The vote to amend the minutes as stated above was favorable. The vote to approve the amended minutes was favorable.

#### FINANCIALS

Pastor Steve Lindley addressed the Office Supplies line item explaining that most of the expenditures from this account are for photocopier rental and copy expenses, and expenses for Realm. Motion by Eric Anderson, seconded by Jean Mitchell, to acknowledge the Financial Report. Motion carried. REPORTS

Pastor Steve Lindley submitted a written report.

Deacon Koren Lindley submitted a written report. She also reported that donations for approximately half of the money needed to feed those attending the National Youth Gathering have been received.

President Tom Farrell reported

- That two CDs were purchased with funds from the I Am In account. They are 7-month CDs in the amount of \$2,000 and \$1,912,28 at 4.75% interest. The Parsonage Fund now has a balance of \$93,693.87.
- The Trinity Foundation was valued at \$899,551.32 as of December 31, 2023. In 2024 \$202,568.00 (Edwin Hanneman Endowment) was transferred to Trinity, and in June, the Foundation awarded \$7,350.00 in grants.
- Kaden Krusemark has indicated that he is able to continue livestreaming the services through the summer and next school year.
- President Tom Farrell, Pastor Steve Lindley, and Steve Millage have developed a job description for the livestreaming position.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reported

- ACS has expressed interest in examining the leak in the narthex roof.
- Marie Millage has investigated telephone and internet providers and found that Midco is Trinity's best option.
- Deacon Koren Lindley and Marie Millage are working on changing the staff email addresses.
- The Board of Trustees requested that Pastor Steve Lindley bring a proposal for a new laptop to the Board. The question of whether Trinity's contract with Infotech requires that new equipment be purchased through Infotech was raised and will be investigated.
- The AED pads have expired. In the past it has been difficult to purchase pads. It may be necessary to purchase new AEDs.

Board of Parish Education—Dani Ruhd reported

 Vacation Bible School plans have been made. There are 50 children, preschool through second grade, registered for VBS. Five older elementaryage children are registered to join the Day Camp at St. John Lutheran.

# **Unapproved June Council Meeting Minutes**

- Dani Ruhd and Deacon Koren Lindley are working on a Sunday School curriculum.
- The next youth activity is scheduled for June 26.

Board of Deacons-Virginia Lemme reported

- There are 13 members on Trinity's Care Team. They are currently establishing a list of individuals who may potentially appreciate a visit.
- Trinity will serve the Gathering on August 26.
- Patti Weber is working with service group leaders to restructure the service groups and is planning to introduce the new structure in September.
- The 80th Birthday Celebration is planned for September 16. It is a celebration for anyone who will be at least 80 years old in 2024.
- Karen Giles is seeking more bakers to make communion bread.

Vice-president Kurt Christiansen had no report.

Pastor Steve Lindley led the Council in a team building exercise utilizing LikeU, a game to end awkward conversations.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- The Council reviewed the report on Internet and phone service. Motion by President Tom Farrell to accept the report and stay with the current provider (Midco). Seconded by Dani Ruhd. Motion carried.
- Pastor Steve Lindley reported that it is difficult to line up worship assistants. The current options are to sign up are either online or on paper in the narthex. The option of asking the service groups to find worship assistants was discussed. The method used at Our Savior's Lutheran in Sioux Falls was presented as another option. This option divides the congregation alphabetically by last name and assigns them to the months of the year. For example, those with last names beginning with A, B, C would serve as worship assistants in January.
- President Tom Farrell appointed a committee of Patti Weber, Deacon Koren Lindley, Stacy Thomsen, and Marie Millage to write a Kitchen Policy. Patti Weber will serve as chair of the committee.
- President Tom Farrell appointed a committee composed of Darrel Presuhn, Pastor Steve Lindley, and Virginia Lemme to develop a membership policy including how to become a member and how is membership recognized. Vice-president

Kurt Christiansen is an ex-officio member of the committee.

Dani Ruhd reported on the God's Work, Our Hands project. The committee is proposing to hold this event on Sunday, September 15. Those providing the "hands" will meet at the church at 8:45 a.m. for prayer and an introduction to the plan for the morning. The project will focus its efforts on Bethel Home because there are many possibilities for service and options for all ages to participate. The work will wrap up around 11:30 a.m. or noon with lunch and worship. There will be no regular worship services at Trinity that Sunday. The committee has been working with a group from St. John Lutheran. Currently there are differences in how to proceed with this joint venture.

#### NEW BUSINESS

- The annual Trinity clean-up will be scheduled for Saturday, August 17, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Shelly Balogh to appoint a committee of Dani Ruhd, Walker Ruhd, and Shelly Balogh to organize the event and advertise the clean-up in the July newsletter with online and paper sign up. Motion carried.
- The air conditioner for the office is not working. It may be the compressor. Sid Gulbranson will check this out.
- Motion by Eric Anderson, seconded by Darrell Presuhn to accept the resignation of Curtis King with sincere regret. Motion carried.
- Motion by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Deacon Koren Lindley, to allow the Preschool Board to open a separate checking account at First Bank & Trust for venmo payments of preschool tuition and other preschool activities with the approval of the Audit Committee. Discussion of the motion included whether this action might lead to a proliferation of accounts for a variety of purposes such as general offering or youth activities. The consensus was that this account will be an experiment which will provide direction for future uses of venmo. Motion carried with one dissenting vote.

Motion to adjourn by Dani Ruhd, seconded by Virginia Lemme.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

I had the privilege of attending the 2024 South Dakota Synod Assembly on May 30 and June 1 with Dani and Walker Ruhd in Sioux Falls. It was a busy two days, but we have so much to be thankful for as a synod! While I can't possibly cover it all, here are some of the highlights!

- SD Synod has 2 new ministries... Shepherd's Table & a new mission start in Box Elder!
- Rural ministry continues to be a focus area, and we now have a Director of Rural Ministry as well as a new way to learn and grow together through Pasque, an online community where SD leaders can learn and grow together, despite the geographical distance.
- Trinity Lutheran Church won a "Holy Cow" Award for their generous giving to ELCA World Hunger!
- SD Synod continues to partner with Cameroon and Nicauragua. Recently, a local church sewing group made a number of products using fabrics gifted from these countries. They are selling them to raise money for those partnerships.
- Voting took place and the following items were approved:
  - 2025 Mission Plan for the SD Synod
  - 2025 Compensation & Guidelines for Clergy & Lay Leaders
  - Synod support of a dedicated chapel area in the new prison being built.

In summary, the South Dakota Synod is doing God's work in so many ways and with so many people and places. While there is still more to be done, we have strong, faithful leaders and there is much to celebrate and look forward to!
