Deacon's Discourse

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink,
I was a stranger and you welcomed me."

June is here and the official start of summer is just weeks away! We have a lot to look forward to here at Trinity this month, so let's talk about it!

June is all about feeding people—locally and globally as well as while traveling! ELCA World Hunger is our mission of the month, and the work they do is so important! ELCA World Hunger not only provides immediate basic needs to those who are hungry, but they also "connect people with the resources they need to produce food and gain access to clean water, education, health care and sources of income [so that] long-term, sustainable change can be accomplished" (www.elca.org). They respond to world hunger from all angles, so they can truly make a lasting difference.

Not only is ELCA World Hunger our mission of the month for June, but we are also using their Vacation Bible School curriculum, God's New Creation, for our "in-house" preschool-2nd grade VBS at the end of the month (June 24-27). This curriculum focuses on how raising animals can reduce world hunger. "Farming communities around the world are important when it comes to ending hunger. They provide the world's food, but often farmers, especially smallholder farmers, are at high risk for hunger themselves. Working with farmers to improve harvests, save money and prepare for the future can be big steps toward ending hunger around the world. This is why ELCA World Hunger works through congregations, partners and companion churches to accompany farmers as they innovate and adapt in creative, effective ways. God's New Creation is about this work together" (www.elca.com). Trinity Lutheran Church is an important partner with ELCA World



Hunger as we not only financially support their mission, but we also embrace their mission and are teaching our younger generations about the importance of farming and fighting world hunger.

Locally, our Middle School and High School groups will be creating "Birthday-in-a-Box" kits on June 26th for the Lake County food pantry. These are special kits that contain a cake pan, cake mix, frosting, candles, and a few fun extras to help our local food



extras to help our local food pantry guests celebrate birthdays.

Finally, we will continue our "Feed the Crew" fund-raiser for the 3 leaders and 15 youth headed to the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July. Your financial donation will go towards their meals while they are attending the conference, doing service projects, and sharing God's love throughout their week away. The youth have worked hard to pay for this trip, and it would be such a blessing to them if we, as a congregation, could cover the cost of their food. Please prayerfully consider sponsoring 1, 2, or even a whole week of meals for one of these leaders or youth.

Trinity's mission statement is "Sharing God's Word, Doing God's Work," and I can't think of a better way to start out the summer than doing just that. Whether you give of your time and talents or financially, we have many options for you in June to make a difference. The Council recited Trinity's mission statement.

President Tom Farrell shared a devotion from Luke 8:22–25 reminding us that God is with us through all life's storms.

Pastor Steve led the Council in prayer.

President Tom Farrell introduced the agenda and added the following items to the printed agenda: 1. Purchase of additional CDs, and 2. Andrew Hunter memorial. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Jean Mitchell, to approve the agenda with additions. Motion carried.

The minutes of the April meeting were changed to include Patti Weber as a member attending the meeting. Motion by Eric Anderson, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion carried.

There is currently a balance of \$3,912.28 in the I Am In account. Motion by President Tom Farrell, seconded by Dani Ruhd, to invest the money in the I Am In account in CDs. President Tom Farrell will investigate rates and terms. Motion carried.

The Hunter family has dedicated \$400 of the memorials received by the Trinity Foundation in memory of Andy Hunter for the purchase of an Urn Pall. To accomplish this, President Tom Farrell made a motion to make the payment of \$400 with 50% of the total coming from the Cornerstone Fund, 25% from the Parish Education Fund and 25% from the Deacons as per the Trinity Foundation distribution of memorial gifts. Seconded by Virginia Lemme. Motion carried

Motion by Eric Anderson, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to acknowledge the Financial Report.

REPORTS

Pastor Steve Lindley reported that

- Andrea Liddell has been hired as the parttime custodian (20–25 hours/week).
- Final preparations are being made for the next Stewardship emphasis.
- He will be gone the first Sunday in July. Tom Farrell will conduct the service and has been given permission by the bishop to serve communion.
- On July 21, Pastor Jeff Backer, St. Dysmas Lutheran Congregation, will give the message.
- The final confirmation class for this school year is May 15.
- The high school youth group wants to continue to meet through the summer.
- He attended a retreat May 3–5 sponsored by Lutheran Men in Mission.
- He is beginning a new book study based on Soul Boom beginning May 30.

Deacon Koren Lindley reported that

- She will be highlighting the opportunity to contribute money to feed the kids attending the National Youth Gathering, July 14–20. Their other expenses—travel, lodging, registration—have been paid.
- She has received many compliments on the kindergarten flower pot planting event and thanked Walker and Dani Ruhd for organizing the event.
- Sunday School concluded on May 5. High school seniors were recognized on May 12.
- The Women's Bible Study will begin a study of the book of James on June 3.
- Trinity preschool is almost full for the coming school year.
- Vacation Bible School for younger children will use the ELCA World Hunger curriculum. Children

- Reported on the Lutheran Men in Mission retreat he attended and encouraged other men to attend future events sponsored by Lutheran Men in Mission.

 That he sat in on the Board of Trustees meeting and intends to rotate through the Board meetings on a regular basis.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

- They are looking for a contractor to work on the Narthex roof.
- Marie Millage is checking on internet and phone services.
- It will be necessary to upgrade the computers—1 desktop and 4 laptops—to Windows 11 within the next year.
- A ladder that will provide easier access to the roof and HVAC units on the roof has been donated. It will need to be installed with a lockable front gate.
- There continue to be issues with the office email.
 Motion by Eric Anderson, seconded by Marie Millage, to transition the office email from the TLCmadison.com domain to gmail effective June 1. Motion carried unanimously.

Board of Deacons—Virginia Lemme reporting

- The summer schedule begins May 26. There will be one Sunday service at 9:30. The first and second Sundays will be Celebration services. The third, fourth, and any fifth Sundays will be traditional services.
- The Care Team will hold an organizational meeting on May 22.
- Jingle change totaled \$295.00 in April and was donated to the Church on the Street. The total for May was also \$295.00 and was given to the Bethel Lutheran Home.
- Trinity will feed the DSU football and volleyball teams on August 28.
- Patti Weber is working with group leaders to re-

fresh the service groups. The plan is to have 9 groups with more families in each group. Current plans are to introduce the revised plan in September and recognize the group leaders.




