Vice president Kurt Christiansen gave a devotion reminding all present that we always have an open line of communication with God through prayer, and that we need to be open to communication when God speaks to us.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Motion by Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Walker Ruhd, to accept the Financial Report. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Pastor Steve reported

- Staff reviews are scheduled for next week.
- They are experiencing some issues with the WIFI in the office. Infotech has been working on the issue.
- Diane Bruns introduced Operation Christmas Child at services last Sunday.
- Plans are being finalized for Confirmation Sunday, All Saints' Sunday, and Hanging of the Greens services.

- Confirmation classes are going well. The ninth graders had a retreat last Sunday, and Pastor Steve is meeting one on one with the ninth graders.
- The high school group continues to meet.
- He and Deacon Koren are exploring possible Advent studies.

Deacon Koren provided a written report.

President Tom Farrell reported

- Work on the 2025 mission statement is proceeding.
- He thanked Dani Ruhd for all her work on the God's Work, Our Hands project. It was a great success with 110 participants.

Board of Deacons—Virginia Lemme reporting

- Hanging of the Greens is scheduled for December 1. The theme is "And on Earth, Peace."
- The care team is visiting 16 homes currently.
- Two service group leaders have resigned. Patti Weber will try rotating the position of leader through members of those groups.
- Lucas Muller has been filming activities for the introductions to volunteer activities.
- Our Savior and Trinity are a presence on the DSU campus. Pastor Rebecca Breddin and Deacon Koren are visiting the campus.

Board of Trustees—Eric Anderson reporting

- A letter has been received from the city of Madison notifying Trinity that it is necessary to replace 330 square feet of sidewalk by July 1, 2025. He will contact the city to learn which areas need to be replaced.
- The AED units will be tested to be sure they work before looking for pads to replace the expired pads.
- Northern Construction from Tea, SD, has been contacted to look at the Narthex window.
- The elevator is not working, Otis Elevator has been contacted.
- The ladder lock is up.
- The digital sign is functional.
- Looking into the addition of a drop box outside the office door.
- The Stewardship Committee is preparing a handout/bulletin insert for Confirmation Sunday.
- Walker Ruhd has refinished the baptismal font.

Pastor Steve has contacted an artist about creating a bowl for the font.

 The Preschool has some plumbing issues. David Neu will be contacted to investigate the cause.

Board of Parish Education—Dani Ruhd reporting

- A cake will be purchased for the coffee hour on Confirmation Sunday.
- Stacy Thomsen is planning a fall activity for the youth and possibly a service project as well.

President Tom Farrell reminded the Boards to have budget proposals ready for discussion at the November meeting.

Vice president Kurt Christiansen reported that the Nominating Committee has met and is actively seeking candidates.

TEAM BUILDING

Pastor Steve asked the members to discuss this question: "At this point in your spiritual journey, what are the biggest questions you are working through?"

OLD BUSINESS

The distribution of the tithe of the Hannemann Funds was discussed. Motion by Kurt Christiansen, seconded by Dani Ruhd, to distribute the funds as follows: \$4,000 to Trinity Preschool for the purchase and installation of playground equipment; \$4,000 to the Trinity Foundation to re-establish the missionary fund; the remainder, \$12,256.00, to the Bethel Foundation. Motion carried. This proposed distribution will be brought to the congregation for a vote at the annual meeting.

Virginia Lemme presented the recommendations of the Membership Committee. Motion by Virginia Lemme, seconded by Kurt Christiansen, to accept the following:

There will be a category in Trinity's rolls to record Trinity mission partner contact information, activity, and giving history. Mission partners will be included in all communications from Trinity, including but not limited to, emails, newsletters, announcements, Sunday School updates, and calendars. We encourage and support the involvement of all our mission partners at Trinity Lutheran Church.

Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Staff compensation for 2025 was discussed. It was noted that Trinity's staff received no raises in 2024, however increases in the cost of benefits for the staff were included in the 2024 mission plan. President Tom Farrell proposed 3% raises for Pastor Steve, Alex Eykamp, and the hourly employees. Because Deacon Koren was hired at a salary below synod
